We have been lucky enough to have some wonderful staff from the Fortuna Community Health Center (aka Open Door Clinic) come and speak to us in our wellness speaker series! Now it's time to take it to the next level and take a guided tour throughout the Center. They have so much to offer the community, and this trip will get people excited about the possibilities!

### Our Saturday potlucks are a ton of fun and our speakers are quite knowledgeable!

Fionna Davis, LCSW, was our May wellness speaker. She was full of humor and very Informative. Fionna explained how seniors can be negatively affected by loneliness, grief, decrease in mobility, increase in pain and anxiety, etc. One of her main lessons is to be aware of integrating the mind/body, and understand how they work together. Sometimes our thoughts can be negative, directly impacting our bodies, leading to increased blood pressure, heart rate, and stress levels. She suggested ways to fill an emptiness you may be experiencing. She likened our minds to a car that keeps pulling to the right, or a border collie running around like crazy. Bringing our mind to a neutral, or even a happy place, can be very beneficial. Fionna suggested that at the end of the day, it's helpful to write five things down that you may have found enjoyable. They don't have to be BIG, like winning the lottery, but rather simple, like enjoying a cup of tea in the morning. Small, manageable changes may improve your mood, hence improving your blood pressure, reducing stress, and managing chronic pain, etc. If you are interested in connecting with Fionna, call the office and Val will provide you with her contact information. She accepts medi-care and will make house calls.


