In addition, we will save approximately \$250 for every bulk mailing of letters to members such as the year end appeal, Overall, I estimate a total savings of \$1500 to \$1600 per year for mailing costs. Much thanks to Carol Kinser for researching what needed to be done to implement non-profit bulk mailing for us.


NEW CLASSES!

POTLUCK NEWS!



- 4. The Board will review and approve it or not.




DEBBI'S CARDMAKING CLASS




