

ENERGY ASSESSMENT

Derek Hilson from RCEA (Redwood Coast Energy Authority), a Senior Energy Technician, recently visited Fortuna Senior Center to provide an energy assessment, focusing on efficient energy use in the daily operation of the Center. Along with Board Member John Schmidt, Derek took notes and talked energy, providing us with an in-depth analysis of how we are doing with both cost and conservation. The assessment shows, since we operate between low peak hours (9 am to 4 pm), we are saving money on costs. The information also will be helpful information when determining the needs of our future Solar plans.

KINETIC GRAND CHAMPIONSHIP

In 1969, the inspiration for a race took place on Main Street in Ferndale, CA. Metal Sculptor Hobart Brown took his son's tricycle, making several modifications to it. It became a sculpture in motion known as the "Pentacycle". Jack Mayes, a fellow gallery owner challenged him to a race. The rest is History. Hobart and Mayes' two-block dash down Ferndale's Main Street is now a three-day marathon event celebrating over 50 years in Humboldt County. People-powered machines traveling 40 miles over land, sand, water and mud every Memorial Day Weekend! A fun time for people of all ages! Here are places you can check it out!

SATURDAY, MAY 24th: Arcata Plaza. Start of the race. Come check out all the sculptures and ride your own bikes with them through Arcata Bottoms to Manila Community Center. One lane of 255 is closed to traffic during this time.

SUNDAY, May 25th: Water Crossing on the Bay in Eureka. Can be seen from various locations. Will enter either Samoa Bridge Launch or Wharfinger dependent on the tide. Fun to watch on the Boardwalk or kayak on the Bay alongside the sculptures.

MONDAY, May 26th: Sculptures arrive at around 1 p.m. in Ferndale on Main Street where you can get a close up look at these amazing machines.

🎲 Pollinators

Attracting pollinators helps increase the yield of your garden. In fact, some squash need several visits from a pollinator for one flower to create one squash! There has been a decrease in populations due to disease and pesticide use. Unfortunately, pesticide use on weeds and pests kills not only the bad bugs but the beneficial ones, too. Plant some flowers in your garden to attract pollinating insects. Borage is easy to grow and attracts large numbers of bees. Pollinating insects are various types of bees, flies, wasps, butterflies and even hummingbirds. Happy Gardening!

Pollinator Friendly Pest Control:

<u>For Weeds:</u>1 gallon of white vinegar, 1 cup salt, 1 TBSP dish soap. Mix well. Put in spray bottle. Shake well before use. Thoroughly saturate weed only. May need to reapply for stubborn ones.

<u>For Pests:</u>1-2 TBSP liquid castile soap (or other mild pure soap) to 4 cups water. Mix. Use spray bottle to apply. Great on aphids!
